Dr. David Wrathall is an assistant professor in the College of Earth, Ocean and Atmospheric Sciences at Oregon State University, and a Lead Author on the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change AR6, WG2, Ch.8: Poverty, Livelihoods and Sustainable Development. David is an expert on climate change and human migration, and studies other wicked social-environmental problems, including the environmental impacts of narco-trafficking in Central America, and the relationship between climate change, violent conflict and human displacement. Previous to Oregon State University, he was an Associate Academic Officer at United Nations University-Institute for Environment and Human Security studying migration around cyclone impacts in Bangladesh, using very large sets of mobile phone data. David holds a PhD in geography from King's College London, where he studied migration from catastrophically flooded coastal communities in Honduras, extending work he began there as a Peace Corps Volunteer.
