1. CONTEXTE

- Cities need energy to survive. But many African cities are facing the phenomenon of "energy poverty".
- Most cities in sub-Saharan Africa still depend on oil lamps and candles for lighting;

- The Communal Development Plan (PDC) of Tsévié (Togo) noted that "39% of houses in the city still use traditional oil lamps and lanterns ;
- There are general voltage drops and frequent power cuts; the current power poles are old and gnawed down; public street lighting is practically non-existent, which plunges the neighborhoods into darkness and therefore into total insecurity

The PPED is a pilot project ... located within the framework of COM SSA ... and funded by the EU ...

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE PPED

The overall objective of this action is to facilitate the sustainable access for people to essential services in the municipality of Tsévié and its surrounding areas through energy efficiency.

More specifically ... it's about :

- ✓ Promote sustainable household energy access in the municipality of Tsévié and its surroundings,

- ✓ Promote sustainable access of schools and health centers to a clean source of energy,
- ✓ Extend public lighting in the main arteries of the city and surrounding towns through solar energy,
- ✓ Promote the use of improved stoves in households for rational management of energy biomass,
- ✓ Contribute to improving Lomé-Tsévié intercity transport.

3. TARGET OF THE PPED

Low-income households / population, schools, health centers in Tsévié commune and surrounding areas ...

4. ACHIEVED RESULTS

95 vulnerable households have access to a clean energy source in the city of Tsévié and the surrounding cantons ;

- Public lighting is carried out in the targeted streets of the city and in habitats grouped from solar panels;
- 5 schools and 5 health centers are powered by solar energy.
This has changed people's lives significantly;

- 8200 households benefited from improved COOKSTOVES;
- 90 young people including some beneficiaries were trained on the maintenance and upkeep of solar equipment.

- Achievement of the Action Plan for Access to Sustainable Energy and Climate (SEAPC);
- Awareness campaign and training in the use and maintenance of kits.
